In my last letter I announced that I've been working on a feature-length documentary based on André Kole's life. This continues to be the major project I've been devoting my time to, and will be for the next several months.

## Doing the Math

To date we have interviewed 52 people, yielding over 36 hours of interview footage. If all 52 of those interviewed are included, that would average less than two minutes each - and quite frankly, that is not going to happen. In actuality, several of the interviews will be included only as bonus material, and not in the feature itself.

## Whittling

Trimming all this down to a 90 minute production is going to be a rather daunting task. One way of managing all this interview footage is to have it transcribed, then we can script via cut-and-paste without getting mired in the nearly 2 terabytes of video files. So, my job this week is to finish up the transcriptions of our latest interview sessions.

## God's Comic

Let me introduce you to the host of the movie - Brad Stine. He was dubbed "God's Comic" by New Yorker magazine because of his focus on Christian faith and conservatism. His material targets liberals, humanists and judgmental Christians and is delivered in an aggressive rat-a-tat style. He is a featured act at Promise Keepers conferences nationwide, and is currently a regular guest on the *Fox and Friends* television
